


## Coping with isolation






# Well located between wineyards and forest!

#### The challenges

- Attractiveness:
  - redevelop industries and high-level services,
  - take advantage of strong research capacity,
  - Look to creative industries
- Job creation: as everywhere in Europe
- Urban sprawl: particularly devastating in the region
  - 55% of existing population, 30% of housing construction
- Climate change:
  - relatively high CO2 production,
  - very sensitive to rises in sea level
- Financing the development: a new challenge that Bordeaux is not really accustomed to facing




#### The equation to be solved

- + 250,000 inhabitants
- + 75,000 jobs
- Stabilise urban spread
- Stabilise urban car traffic
- → towards urban intensification in the center and surrounding areas





#### Creation of housing units


- Today: 5,000 new housing units each year
- Goal: 9,000 new housing units each year

- How: main urban projects areas
- A new way of building the city: 50,000 housing units around public transport lines.






### Capitalizing on high-speed train to become a European Metropolis

#### The role of high-speed train

The extension of the high-speed train network is a unique opportunity for Bordeaux to achieve those goals and enter the privileged club of the 30 leading European cities






### Capitalizing on high-speed train to become a European Metropolis

#### Developing a transportation hub in Bordeaux-Saint-Jean

The future train station will interconnect:

- The international scale (high-speed train)
- The regional scale (intensification of regional train services)
- The metropolitan scale (densification of the urban transportation network)
- The local scale (creation of a cycling network)






### Capitalizing on high-speed train to become a European Metropolis

#### Developing a European CBD and the related urban amenities

Bordeaux-Euratlantique is an urban scheme of national interest

It accounts for 10% of the new population and 20% of the new jobs the metropolis aims to attract by 2030
